Cosmetic Laser Tattoo Removal Pre and Aftercare for Eyeliner

Please read pre and aftercare instructions carefully.

Adhering to aftercare instructions is essential to maximise results and reduce the risk of post-treatment complications.

PRE CARE PRIOR TO YOUR TREATMENT

- Avoid exercise on the day of treatment
- Avoid applying any products on the treatment area on the day of treatment
- Remove false eyelashes 1 week prior to treatment
- Cease use of retinol and exfoliating chemicals for 4 weeks prior to treatment.
- Avoid tinting for 4 weeks prior to treatment
- Keep the treatment area protected from UV light and self-tanning products for 4 weeks prior to treatment
- Use SPF 50 around the area and polarised sunglasses if the area is exposed to the sun
- If there is broken skin or inflammation in the treatment area, such as a stye, please contact us in advance as we may need to re-arrange your appointment.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE HEALING PROCESS

Immediately after treatment, you may notice redness around the area and a sensation similar to sunburn. Sometimes you will experience localised swelling as a reaction to the treatment, this will return to normal in a matter of hours/days.

For some, the skin may appear completely normal shortly after treatment, while others might experience dryness, scabbing, or (rarely) minor bleeding. The healing response varies based on treatment intensity, ink saturation, and skin sensitivity.

Please keep a mental or photographic record of your healing process so your practitioner can adjust your next session accordingly.

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AFTERCARE

Avoid excess heat

- Take tepid showers and avoid sweaty workouts for up to 72 hours post-treatment
- Avoid sources of intense heat, such as saunas, for 14 days
- For eyeliner treatments, be especially cautious of intense heat from ovens or kettles throughout your treatment journey

Avoid UV exposure

- Schedule hot holidays at least 3 weeks before or after a treatment
- Avoid sun beds entirely for optimal healing
- Apply SPF 50 around the area and wear polarised sunglasses when out in the sun throughout treatments

Keep the treatment area clean and dry

- Make Up can be worn 48 hours after treatment, providing the skin is fully in tact.
- Skincare routines can be resumed 48 hours after treatment, with the exception of retinols and chemical exfoliants
- Avoid tinting eyelashes throughout the removal journey

If scabbing occurs:

- Do not rub or scratch scabs
- Allow scabs to fall off naturally over time forcibly removing a scab can cause scarring

If blistering occurs:

- Keep a record of the severity and duration of healing
- Keep them clean and dry
- Do not pop blisters unless instructed by a doctor
- If a blister does pop, apply anti-septic cream and keep the area dressed to avoid contact with clothing and potential contaminants. Change dressings frequently.

ADVERSE REACTIONS

While scabs and blisters are not necessarily a cause for concern, they do increase the risk of an infection, which is why it's imperative to keep the area clean.

If you have severe prolonged pain, weeping from the area or a fever, this may mean an infection. If an infection does occur, you should consult your doctor to obtain oral antibiotics.

Please contact us if an adverse reaction occurs
